#### Sustainability Science Journal

The journal Sustainability Science offers insights into interactions between nature and human society, and the complex mechanisms that sustain both. It provides a transdisciplinary platform that contributes to building sustainability science as a new academic discipline. Sustainability science investigates the root causes of problems by uncovering new knowledge from different disciplines in a holistic way, in order to enhance our understanding of sustainability.

Sustainability Science is published by the AGS-affiliated Integrated Research System for Sustainability Science (IR3S), an Asian research and education network founded by the University of Tokyo.

Authors are encouraged to be problem oriented, proposing visions, methods and policy recommendations for sustaining natural and human systems and their linkages.

The journal especially encourages research on the needs of developing countries for poverty reduction, education, sustainable development and human and environmental security. Open access is available through the OARE initiative.

#### Implementing Sustainability at Conferences

In this report, the ETH Zurich Bachelor students Franziska Elmer and Annina Brunner have carried out a careful investigation of the sustainability impacts of the AGS Annual Meeting 2009. As well as analysing the sustainability impacts of the travel, hotel use, catering and printing, the report describes communication measures for conference participants such as how to calculate compensation measures for a printed abstracts book, and provides recommendations for what steps conference organizers can take to improve the sustainability footprint of their conference.

#### Intensive Program on Sustainability (IPoS)

The Intensive Program on Sustainability (IPoS) provides an opportunity for interna-

tional students to obtain a deeper appreciation for global sustainability through a focus on Asia's key role in achieving global sustainability. Students from The University of Tokyo, the Asian Institute of Technology (AIT), AGS and IR3S universities lodge together in short intensive courses, study through experience-based learning that includes lectures, group discussions, field works and student presentations, and cultivate friendship across different nationalities and academic backgrounds.

IPoS 2009 was held in Rayong, Thailand, in August, with focus on the topics of water, energy and food. It was attended by 23 students from 17 different countries, with students from diverse cultural backgrounds and different fields of study.
